Armenian Genocide Remembrance Competition

The A.G.B.U. Manoogian Armenian Arts Competition has become a popular annual event. Students have a wonderful opportunity to reflect upon Armenia's history and the genocide.

This year, there were 27 entries of literary and visual works among the middle school students. Eighth-grader Linda Kalfayan won first prize for her creative painting and corresponding essay on Armenia, 8th-grader Arsen Melkonyan taking second place for his collage of Armenia and 7th-graders Lena Ferhadson and Ani Karibian tying for third place with their essays. Honorable mention awards were given to 7th-grader Nicholas Aznavour, 8th-grader Yaroslav Shtyha and 6th-grader Solomiya Svytka.

There were 40 entries (with 61 overall participants) among the high school students, who either individually or as teams produced three-dimensional projects, often featuring churches, crosses and architectural monuments such as Sardarabad.

The winners were 11th-grader Angelica Terhune, whose statue entitled, "The future is in my own hands," earned first place. Tenth-graders Dolores Duduman and Zara Gilbert and 9th-grader Dominique Duduman earned second place for their grand depiction of Armenia's history and 10th-graders Sylvia Hanna and Natalie Pope taking third place for their multi-faceted monument to Armenia. Honorable mention went to 10th-grader Sarine Dakissian, 11th-graders Vazken Hartounian and Michael Kalfayan and 9th-grader Julia Papiyants.

The National Honor Society and National Junior Honor Society

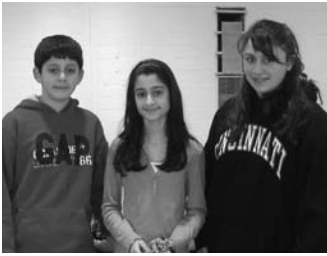
inductions were held on Thursday, May 31, at the Manoogian School.
