2006 Graduation Ceremonies

The AGBU Alex & Marie Manoogian School graduation ceremonies were events that all the students, parents, and teachers had been anxiously awaiting. The seniors – the largest and most successful class to ever graduate from Manoogian School – walked the stage for commencement on June 5. Following in their footsteps, the kindergarteners graduated on June 8, and the fifth- and eighth-graders graduated on June 12.

The high school graduation kicked off with a welcome address by principal, Dr. Hosep Torossian. Greetings followed from the Chairman of the Board of Education, Dr. Richard Marburger. The keynote speech was given by Alex Manoogian Armenian history chair at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Dr. Gerard Libaridian, who is also the former Ambassador-at-Large and Advisor to the first President of the Independent Republic of Armenia, Levon Ter-Petrosian. Speeches delivered by the graduating seniors included Valedictorian Ani Toumajan, Salutatorian Naro Babaian, class president Reyna Harabedian, and Keisha Jackson. After the address of the upper school head teacher Judith Kadri, and a performance by the Manoogian choir – under the

direction of Rubik Mailian and piano accompaniment by Margaret Benian – the 30 proud graduates walked the stage and received their well-earned and long-awaited diplomas. With diplomas in their hands and smiles on their faces, the class of 2006 glowed with motivation to take on the world.

The fifth- and eighth-grade graduation ceremony packed the hall to capacity with a most attentive and appreciative audience which also bore witness to the achievements of so many children. Principal Dyana Kezelian delivered the welcome address. Fifth- grade teacher, Ms. Sona Kalfayan, presented the graduation certificates to the fifth-graders, while Suzanne Collins distributed the certificates to eighth-graders.

All-School Program 2006

The AGBU Manoogian School held its All-School program on Monday, May 15, in St. John's hall. This year's program was dedicated to the 100th Anniversary of the Armenian General Benevolent Union (AGBU). All year, elementary students prepared dances and songs, with the help of dance teacher Mrs. Nayiri Karapetian and music teacher Mrs. Arsho Avedikian. Middle and high school students practiced their Armenian dances, choreographed by Mrs. Karapetian, and songs, with choir director Deacon Rubik Mailian.

Highlights of the program included simulations of a city council and the Michigan Senate. During the city council simulation, everyone had a role to fulfill – whether it was a council member, city manager, planning commissioner, or an involved citizen. During the Michigan Senate simulation, all “senators” were required to write a bill covering an important issue in Michigan.

The “senators” chose their political parties – Democrat, Republican, or Independent – and each party chose their governor and lieutenant governor. The three governor candidates had a gubernatorial debate.

Along with the intensive learning, the students enjoyed the Albion campus and participated in recreational activities with new friends. The program also included a trip to Lansing to see the Capitol Building and Hall of Justice. Here, participants met the Minority and Majority Michigan Senate Floor Leaders and the Chief Justice of the Michigan Supreme Court.

Peer Mediation
