

### **Hero Essay Competition**



Once the ribbon was cut at the entrance of the STEAM Center, everyone headed inside to see different designs or creations by students. The event featured 18 different presentations by elementary, middle school and high school students. These students spent the previous month preparing and testing their presentation. Projects showcased included robots, student-built cars, and micro bit robots. Other students displayed diagrams or tinker cad designs. Elementary students presented science experiments of their own. These presentations were coordinated through the efforts of Mrs. Armoudlian, Mrs. Valenti, Mr. Scott, and Mr. Shroeder,

Food was served outside of the STEAM Center in the high school atrium.

The steam center features an office, a computer lab, whiteboards, and smart-boards for brainstorming ideas. There is a garage door to allow for welding and testing student-built cars. There is also a massive work area with a variety of power tools. A trophy display is also on exhibit that showcases all the awards won.

Construction officially started in the summer of 2021 and the workers spent countless hours working creating a massive addition to the A.G.B.U. Alex and Marie Manoogian School. Costing 2 million dollars, the goal of the STEAM Center is to provide students with a hands-on, interactive learning experience.

All the students are so ecstatic to have the hot lunches back....and maybe we could have more hot lunches throughout the month!




### **American Sign Language**







### Azerbaijan Attacks Armenia

When Azerbaijan attacked multiple areas in the southern part of Armenia this past September, it was very heartbreaking and sad. I had just visited those same areas that were bombed a month before. It is very sad that some countries feel violence and war is the way to get what they want. Azerbaijan wants to take over Armenia and keeps making false statements that Armenia's land is really their land. Azerbaijan is not even more than 100 years old, and they think they could claim a country that is thousands of years old. Why do they think they can do this?

Azerbaijan has a lot of money because they sell oil, and many countries are now starting to buy oil from them because of the Russian and Ukrainian War. This is just making them even stronger and richer which is very scary and dangerous for Armenia. In addition, Turkey helps Azerbaijan by giving them weapons, drones, and F16 planes to fight with. How can the world seem to think this is all acceptable? Armenians are tortured and dying every day, and it feels like no one really cares. It is very sad that not all the wars and evil things that are happening every day are being reported equally. In fact, most people don't even know anything about what is happening to my friends and family in Armenia. Why? Why do some countries seem to matter more than other countries? Aren't all people supposed to be equal?

There is nothing good that comes from war, just death, sadness, and destruction. There were more than 300 deaths, and dozens of injuries this past month. There are other wars happening in the world too, like Ukraine and Russia. It's not fair what Russia's doing to Ukraine, and it's not fair what Azerbaijan is doing to Armenia. The difference is the whole world knows what Russia is doing, and they have boycotted Russia in many ways. They also have helped Ukraine with millions of dollars and weapons. Many people know this is happening and are trying their best to pray and to send supplies to Armenia too, but it is nowhere near the support Ukraine gets from the world.

America has done as much as possible to help Ukraine with weapons and money, but America doesn't really want to be involved with the attacks in Armenia. Nancy Pelosi who is The Speaker of the House of Representatives, visited Armenia to show her support, but not much more than words of support is what was given. Armenia's prayers would be answered if America and the world would help Armenia in the same way they help Ukraine. Armenia is a very peaceful, beautiful, and an amazing place to visit, with welcoming people. I have been lucky to visit twice, and I am so worried for Armenia and all my friends and family who are living there today. I am worried one day we won't have an Armenia anymore, and our beautiful country will be destroyed and lost.

#### Armenia

On the morning of September 12, the people living close to the border of Azerbaijan woke up to horrible news: Azerbaijan attacked Armenia again! But this time, the attacks took place on the international borders between Armenia and Azerbaijan. They desecrated major cities of Jermuk, Artanish, Vardenis, Sotk, Ishkhanasar, Goris, Ghapan, and Stepanakert with no regard for human life.

On September 16, 2022, a female Armenian soldier was raped, tortured, mutilated, and killed by Azerbaijani soldiers. The next day, Nancy Pelosi visited Armenia. She visited the Armenian Genocide Memorial to pay her respect. Pelosi condemned Azerbaijan for committing war crimes against Armenia in, both, the recent war and the Artsakh war of 2020.

Current statistics of the attacks reflect the following: 36 villages shelled, 192 homes destroyed, 2 schools blown up, and 1 hospital destroyed. Along with the destruction, over 5,000 civilians have been displaced from their homes, civilian death tolls at 45 and over 15 civilians wounded. On the front, over 300 soldiers have been killed and over 500 Armenians are being held as prisoners of war.

Some background information. Azerbaijan, with help from Turkey and Pakistan, used heavy artillery and Turkish drones to ruin Armenian cities; Armenia, on the other hand, has received no help or aid.


With Russia focusing on Ukraine, Azerbaijan prepared for a full-scale invasion of Armenia. Azerbaijan's goal is to remove Armenia allowing for a connection between its country and Turkey. This has the Pan-Turkism dream: to unite all Turkic countries, and rebuild the Ottoman Empire. Armenia is in the way of that dream. Azerbaijan took advantage of Russia's distraction to strike, leaving Armenia with little help.

The Azeris hate for the Armenian people results from the First Artsakh War in 1992-1993 which resulted in an Armenian victory. Over the years, the Azeris claim that Artsakh has always been theirs, but 98% of Artsakh is inhabited by Armenians. These days, the actions of the Azeris reflect hatred through the

desecration of gravesites and then decorating their vehicles with the remains of the dead.

The relationship between Armenia and other countries have been improving; India, retaliating against Pakistan's' help toward Azerbaijan, has sent some weapons to Armenia. Also, Iran is demanding to have a shared border with Armenia and has threatened Azerbaijan multiple times.

Most recently, over 1300 females enrolled to participate in Armenia's defense, and the EU has recorded Azerbaijani's aggression and occupation of Armenian territories. The aggression of the Armenian people is still ongoing while the world stays silent.

Middle School girls meet every Tuesday and Thursdays for volleyball practice after school.


The playground is almost done with its constructions. Although the fencing that goes around the playground still needs to be completed, a basketball net has been added and the play structure has been repainted.

cons join the existing battle on Earth between Autobots and Decepticons. The release date of the movie is June 9, 2023, and it is a movie produced by Paramount Pictures.




Ant-man and the Wasp: Quantumania
